Tom & Candy Chambers Harvest Their Blessings to Help Others

hen Tom and **Candy Chambers** considered the places where they wanted to make a charitable gift this past year, the couple looked to causes tied to their faith, as well as the Friendship Home. Tom was just finishing up 10 years on the Friendship Home Association Board of Directors and two years on the Friendship Home Foundation Board. "Candy and I have a goal each year, and we felt it was important to support the community and the Friendship Home Foundation," says Tom.

As a farmer, Tom learned from his CPA a way to give that allowed the Chambers to give more—a method good for the Foundation and for them—a gift of grain. The gift was relatively simple and very tax-efficient to make. "Our CPA is always stressing this is the best way for us to make gifts," Tom says. The Chambers' gift to the Foundation, though, goes far beyond a monetary donation. While on the Board of the Directors, Tom served as Board Chair for four years. "Being a part of this community, I felt the need to give back," Tom explains. Originally, he joined the Board

to fill a vacancy and was curious to learn more about the facility and the industry. "I learned far more than I could have ever given back," he says. Discovering how the reimbursement system works and the business side of the nursing home piqued his interest. Beyond that, it allowed him to help the entire community.

"The residents who live at the Home have given to the community all of their lives and this is an opportunity to pay them back," he says. "On the practical side, I also look at how many employees the Friendship Home has. The wages we pay these individuals, who mostly

live in Audubon, turn over to our Main Street businesses, local churches and more. It felt like the right thing to do to be involved and benefit our community."

Gifts of Commodities

more that way." —Tom Chambers haritable gifts can come in many different forms. If you're a farmer, you may want to consider the benefits of giving grain or livestock. It's a tax-wise way to benefit the

charity of your choice—a winwin situation. sale in income and thereby minimizes taxes. Tax savings may be realized on federal income tax, state income tax and selfemployment tax, depending on the farmer's specific circumstances.

The farmer still has the ability to claim all production costs as deductible expenses for income tax purposes.

- All burdens and benefits of owning the commodity belong to the charity. As owner, the charity is responsible for arranging the hauling of the commodity to market (if the commodity is in home storage). The charity must also pay for any storage fees (if in home storage, this would be to the donor). The charity may also desire to insure the commodity
- Prior to any gift, always consult with tax or legal advisors to ensure the gift is appropriate to your tax situation. Then notify the charity in advance of making a gift of grain, as there are specific procedures that need to be followed to obtain the desired tax treatment.

Tax Savings

Donating commodities outright results in greater tax savings than a direct gift of cash.

 Because the grain or livestock is transferred prior to sale, the farmer does not have to include the

Special Guidelines

 For a commodity donation, all control and ownership must be transferred to the charity prior to sale. The warehouse or sale barn receipt must list the charity as the owner and the charity must order the sale of the commodity.

Friendship Home Wish List

When you make a gift to the Friendship Home Foundation, you can make it unrestricted, allowing the Board to direct the funds to the Home's greatest needs. You also have the option of directing your gift to a specific item, department or program. If you would like ideas for how your donation could be spent, following are items on the Friendship Home's current "wish list."

- Waterproof recliners for resident rooms (\$700/ each)
- Automated External Defibrillator (\$2,000)
- White tables and chairs for outdoor activities (\$150/set)

If making a gift for a specific item, it is best to give us the funds to buy the item rather than purchase it for us.

Help Your Neighbor Fund

You can designate a charitable gift to allow those residents with limited financial means to do extras—go out to eat on a "Dutch treat," buy a family member a Christmas present, send flowers to a relative's funeral, etc.
